Dear fellow OSU Master Gardener Volunteers,

What an amazing year! I learned a lot and met some great people. My thanks to all of you who contributed in so many ways. Your efforts are appreciated and are one of the things that make ours an outstanding program. Thanks so much to all who could make it out to our events, it was so great to see so many familiar faces at the meetings too. I know our new MGVs really appreciate your support and are looking forward to contributing in the next year.

We all need to take turns doing the hard tasks and sharing in leadership. Our program excels when our people are interdependent on each other's skills, capabilities, and unique arrangement of gifts, talents or resources. This reminds me of a flock of geese in their V shape I recently saw flying overhead.

A goose was struggling to lead the formation and rise out of the field. Each bird following was flying slightly above the bird in front of them, reducing wind resistance. The geese take turns being the leader, falling back to the end of the v when they get tired. This means they can fly for a long time before they need to rest. The V formation makes it easier to keep track of every bird in the group. They "Honk" for recognition and to encourage each other (including the leaders) to keep each one motivated.

When a goose gets injured or sick, two other geese will fall out of formation to stay with the goose and stay with it until it is able to fly again. When they head back out, they work together to catch up with the rest of the flock. As a whole, the team is only as strong as your weakest team member.

Below are just a few lessons we can learn from these birds:

- Support each other to reach a common goal.
- Working together as a team is invaluable.
- Accept support when needed.
- Give recognition often.
- Create a sense of community.

Please remember our requirements to be an active member are:

Deadline to submit hours is December 31, 2022

OBTAINING VOLUNTEER HOURS:

20 documented volunteer hours are required annually to maintain active status. Approved volunteer hours must be MGV related and may include:

- 2 hours must come from Backyard and Local Food events
- 2 hours must come from Environmental Horticulture events
- Approved projects to obtain volunteer hours are committee-driven
- If you desire to volunteer for a project not committee-driven, you must submit your request in writing for approval from an OSU Educator at the beginning of the year
- Attending monthly meetings will equal one volunteer hour (and one education hour see below)
- Refer to the committee list and description
- You may NOT record any hours you are paid for

OBTAINING CONTINUING EDUCATION HOURS:

10 documented education hours are required annually to maintain active status. Approved continuing education hours must be MGV related and may include:

• 2 hours must be from integrated pest management classes or presentations

- 2 hours must be from invasive species classes or presentations
- Attending monthly MGV meeting where a speaker presents a program
- Attend an MGV-sponsored field trip with a specialist tour guide

You have until April 24th to get your 50 volunteer hours completed and entered into Hands On Connect. Only after the completion of your 50 volunteer hours will you be considered an Active Master Gardener. Please let Kristen know if you have any questions.
