Dear fellow OSU Master Gardener Volunteers,

The new year is here. Snuggle up inside because that winter wind is chilly. This is a great time to take a moment to consider why you became an OSU Master Gardener volunteer. We all love being in our gardens and working with plants. Yes, you gain knowledge, make better choices, spending your time, money, and energy wisely. But you may want to know there are many benefits.

Volunteering allows us to meet like-minded people and connect with them. Making these connections is valuable as we age and especially for many who live alone. Social isolation and loneliness are linked to several health issues, including heart disease, high blood pressure, depression, and anxiety.

You wanted to be part of and contribute to something worthwhile? Volunteering as an OSU Master Gardener lets you physically support something you care about and meet people who share your values. If you have trouble motivating yourself to go outside and see the world, volunteering is a great way to give yourself the push you need to escape from the house.

We volunteer to improve things in our community, so becoming an active volunteer is a great way to strengthen your bond with your community. Taking an active part in a community can give you a sense of social connection and belonging, which can stave off stress, and feelings of loneliness and improve your sense of self-confidence. Some studies have shown working to help others actually reduces feelings of chronic pain and improves overall health.

A large part of being an OSU MG volunteer is sharing what you learned by talking with others and effectively expressing yourself. The more you talk, the more you learn to advocate, which leads to higher levels of self-confidence.

Most of the work we do involves the giving or receiving of skills and information. When you take the time to learn new skills and pass them along to others, you keep your mind sharp by enhancing your memory and thinking abilities, which is an especially important benefit for older volunteers. We really need to keep learning, thinking, and doing things to stay healthy.

I am asking you to continually challenge yourself, get involved, research, and learn something new. Then think about how this can benefit others and make a plan to share your knowledge. This also applies to our leadership. Volunteer to share your experience and hone your skills by helping lead a committee or planning an event. We all have skills and abilities that can contribute to having a great program and have a positive effect on our community. The new year brings new opportunities for us to learn and grow as individuals too.

# **OBTAINING VOLUNTEER HOURS:**

20 documented volunteer hours are required annually to maintain active status. Approved volunteer hours must be MGV related and may include:

- 2 hours must come from Backyard and Local Food events
- 2 hours must come from Environmental Horticulture events
- Approved projects to obtain volunteer hours are committee-driven
- If you desire to volunteer for a project not committee-driven, you must submit your request in writing for approval from an OSU Educator at the beginning of the year
- Attending monthly meetings will equal one volunteer hour (and one education hour see below)
- Refer to the committee list and description
- You may NOT record any hours you are paid for

## **OBTAINING CONTINUING EDUCATION HOURS:**

10 documented education hours are required annually to maintain active status. Approved continuing education hours must be MGV related and may include:

• 2 hours must be from integrated pest management classes or presentations

- 2 hours must be from invasive species classes or presentations
- Attending monthly MGV meeting where a speaker presents a program
- Attend an MGV-sponsored field trip with a specialist tour guide

## MGV Intern Hours

You have until April 24<sup>th</sup> to get your 50 volunteer hours completed and entered into Hands On Connect. Only after the completion of your 50 volunteer hours will you be considered an Active Master Gardener. Please let Kristen know if you have any questions.

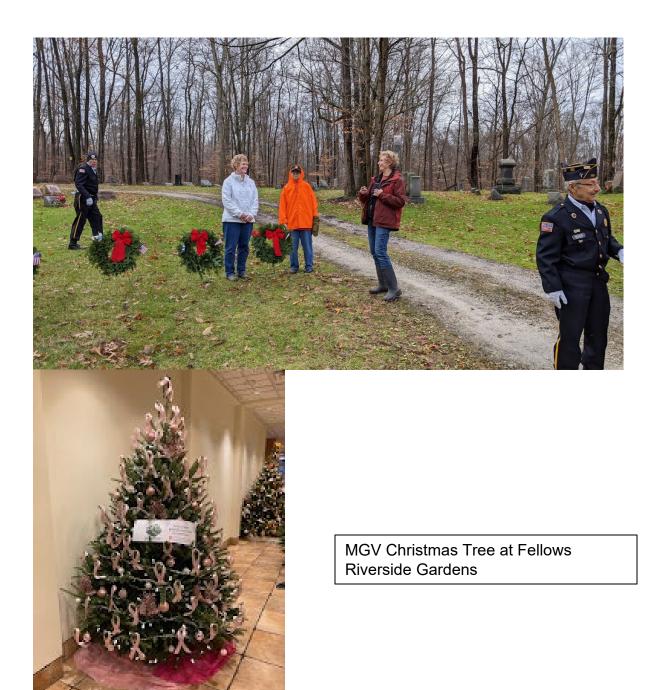
