- This project requires access to a horse.
- Use with 190R Equine Record Book.
- Intermediate level.

## Roping (187)

- Youth will learn about the history of roping and the different types of ropes and how they are made.
- Several types of roping events are featured—ground, roping, mounted competition, breakaway roping, goat tying, tie-down roping, and team roping.
- Project may be repeated.
- 190R Equine Record Book is required if participating in mounted events.
- All levels.









## Cloverbud Collection

#### FOR OUR YOUNGEST "MEMBERS"


- Developmentally age-appropriate materials for youth age 5 and in kindergarten to age 8 and in the third grade.
