

SUCCULENT PHOTO FRAME

TOOLS:

hammer

nails 3/4" finishing nails

glue (E-6000)

chopstick or pencil

knife

hanger attachment if plan to hang frame

MATERIALS:

succulents plants or cuttings (let dry 24 hour to callous)

picture frame (with glass and back removed)

landscape fabric (cut 1" larger than built shadow box)

soil moist

1x2 lumber (to build the shadow box for the back of picture frame)

3x8" plywood (cut to fit back of picture frame)

ASSEMBLY OF SUCCULENT PHOTO FRAME

Cut and build shadow box to fit back of photo frame where the glass sat, drill a few holes in one end for drainage.

Cut landscape fabric 1" larger than shadow box.

Place landscape fabric over frame opening (where glass sat) Then glue around edge of shadow box and push shadow box down into frame opening on top of landscape fabric. Let glue dry. Trim excess fabric around shadow box.

This is the time to paint you frame.

Fill with moist soil and attach the plywood back.

Lay out your design ahead of planting, then cut slit into landscape fabric and use pencil make space in soil to allow planting of your succulent plants. Keep frame flat to allow rooting of succulents.
