Naloxone, also known as Narcan[®], is a medication that can block the effects of opioids and reverse an overdose. Naloxone is very safe and cannot be abused. If you give naloxone to someone who is not experiencing an opioid overdose, it will not harm them. In Ohio, anyone can legally carry and administer naloxone. Mahoning County Public Health –Fentanyl Test Strips (FTS)

A wide variety of street drugs can be laced with fentanyl. Fentanyl Test Strips can be used to test substances, like heroin, cocaine, or meth, for the presence of fentanyl. Test strips are not guaranteed to detect all forms of fentanyl. Knowing fentanyl is present in your substance gives you some options, like choosing not to use it; starting with a smaller amount; or going slow while using.
