

# Shooting Sports Clubs

The 4-H Shooting Sports Program was introduced nationally in 1980. Ohio 4-H Youth Development implemented the program in April 1992. Shooting sports are open to all youth ages 8 to 19 interested in learning and practicing the safe and responsible use of firearms and archery equipment.

Shooting sports are taught in a group setting under the direct supervision of certified instructors, which is different than the independent 4-H projects completed with the guidance from parents and advisors. Due to the nature of the program, youth can be denied participation if their behavior or attitude causes unsafe conditions. 4-H Certified Shooting Sports Instructors are adults who have successfully completed the 4-H volunteer application process and weekend training workshop for one of the shooting sports disciplines. Disciplines include shotgun, archery, muzzle-loader, living history, rifle, pistol, and hunting and wildlife.
